In our continuous mission to
protect the integrity and

Marine Org, it is imperative to
acknowledge the dangers posed
by counter-operations and
reinforce the consequences for
those who dare to challenge our
authority. To this end, we
present the cautionary tale of
Subject 2437: a stark warning

for any who seek to undermine us.

The Origin of the Threat

subject 2437, a 26-year-old woman from an unremarkable background, was identified as a counter-operative after consistently calling an Emtanon-associated phone line, known only to those entrenched in espionage circles. Night after night, she dialed the number, meticulously decoding fragments of our encrypted transmissions. Initial Threat Assessment

Subject 6721, a 29-year-old male from El Paso, Texas, was flagged as a low-priority counter-operative after sporadically dialing Emtanon's encrypted phone lines. His early activity suggested curiosity, if not intent, to decode sensitive transmissions. Over several weeks, he compiled notes, decrypted fragments, and even attempted to piece together dead drops.

Our analysts projected that he might evolve into a moderate

threat-potentially a recruit for larger counter-operations. Surveillance protocols were put into place, and the Shadow Team was prepared for extraction should his involvement deepen. However, a sudden shift in behavior was noted: Subject 6721 ceased all activity without provocation.

Watch." Passive surveillance
will be maintained until it is
determined he poses no future
risk.

Subject 6721's story is both a
relief and a caution. While
emotional entanglements may
deter certain individuals, they
also pose a wildcard factor we
cannot predict. Vigilance
remains essential. The sea of
potential threats may ebb and
flow, but we must always be
prepared for the tide to turn.
